We recommend that you check the weather forecast prior to your departure so that you can pack accordingly.

The best times to visit India are at the beginning and end of the year in the beginning and end of the cool season. Daytime temperatures are still quite high, but evenings are dryer and cooler. If your tour visits mountains or hill stations, temperatures and humidity levels will be significantly lower so you will need to take warmer clothes with you. The major cities in India are becoming increasingly westernised in their clothing and attitudes, however in the smaller towns and villages people still dress a little more traditionally and conservatively.

If you are visiting Spiti, Ladakh, Little Tibet:

The best months to visit are **June, July, September, October and November**. These times of year experience the most favourable weather in Ladakh, when there is minimal rainfall and the best road conditions possible. However, no matter the time of year, or how warm it is, sudden and unpredictable drops in temperature, snow or storms can hit on the mountain passes. The sun is also much stronger at high altitude so you can be sunburnt more quickly.

These months are also the start and end of the hot season in Delhi and Amritsar so temperatures and humidity levels are higher. (See weather temperatures for Delhi, Amritsar, Dharamsala, Leh and Manali)

If you are visiting the Himalayan Kingdoms:

North-eastern India & Himachal/Kashmir have a sub-tropical climate. During the months of **March, April and May** it is their equivalent to spring before the monsoon season and during the months of **September, October and November** it is their equivalent to autumn after the monsoon season – during these months it is the coolest and driest time of year. The lower altitude coastal plains experience warm and humid weather with cooler evenings. The higher altitude hill stations of Sikkim and mountainous areas of Bhutan are also at their most pleasant, although temperatures are significantly lower and there are occasional heavy rains. **Remember that at high altitude**, no matter the time of year; sudden and unpredictable drops in temperature, snow or storms can hit on the mountain passes. The sun is also much stronger so you can be sunburnt more quickly. (See weather temperatures for Kolkata, Darjeeling, Gangtok, Thimpu and Wangdue Phodrang). The monsoon usually arrives in mid-June, with light rain falling mainly in the afternoons and evenings.

Consider your packing carefully. Generally, casual clothes are recommended. Loose fitting, lightweight cotton materials are the most comfortable for humid weather, while layers of warmer clothes are advised for cooler evenings. A waterproof jacket will be required for the wetter conditions in April. The dress code throughout the tour is casual; however, it is important that all passengers dress conservatively. Smart casual clothes are suitable for evening banquets and shows, but are not compulsory.

Refer to your [Travel Guide/Fact Sheet](#) about how to dress appropriately for this culture and advice about choosing your luggage. Please note, due to restrictions on your internal flights, your luggage allowance is **15kg for checked luggage** and 5 kg for hand luggage.

Example packing list:

- ✓ Your travel documents and passport – including a photocopy of your passport in case it is lost or stolen whilst you are travelling. Keep one photocopy at home and take another photocopy on your trip with you.
- ✓ Main luggage and 'day bag' – a smaller bag to carry with you during the day.
- ✓ Luggage padlocks.

- ✓ Money belt to carry passport, cash, credit cards, airline tickets, etc.
- ✓ Comfortable trousers & shorts (or skirts for women).
- ✓ Shirts or long-sleeved tops of light cotton material.
- ✓ Walking shoes, sandals and socks – it is important to have sturdy and comfortable shoes for sightseeing every day.
- ✓ A water/windproof jacket and small umbrella.
- ✓ Sun protection – hat, sunscreen, sunglasses and lip balm.
- ✓ Personal medical kit.
- ✓ Antibacterial wipes and or gel – to clean hands before eating.
- ✓ Some clothing covering the knees and shoulders for visits to religious sites. Women may find a ‘modesty shawl’ or sarong useful.
- ✓ Old pair of socks to wear when visiting temples.
- ✓ Small torch, conversion plug and spare batteries – batteries available to buy locally tend to be unreliable.
- ✓ Scarf or bandana to protect your face against dusty winds in high altitude areas.
- ✓ Spare glasses/contact lenses – it is difficult to get any prescription lenses repaired locally.
- ✓ Toilet paper – not all sightseeing public toilets will provide this.
- ✓ Snacks – tea bags/coffee, milk powder or sachets, muesli bars, instant soups or noodles, or anything else you can’t live without!
- ✓ Camera and spare film/memory card – film available locally tends to be bad quality or sun damaged.
- ✓ If travelling to Ladakh – ‘Sleep sheet’ or compact and lightweight sleeping bag – at remote accommodations linen is provided but possibly not up to Australian standard.
- ✓ Tracksuit/similar outfit of soft material is recommended for overnight train journeys as well as a small bath towel.
